## **Brighton Police Blotter for November 11, 2010**

Burglary 2<sup>nd</sup> ARREST CR# 029787 Spier Avenue 11/05/10. Louis Velez-Prospel, male Hispanic, age 19, of Lake Ave; and Edward Vega, male Hispanic, age 20, of Second Street, were arrested for burglarizing a home on Spier Ave and one on Avalon Drive, and for breaking into vehicles in Brighton. The two are believed to be responsible for many of the vehicle larcenies in town, including those occurring recently on Avalon Drive, Duffield Road, Schilling Lane, and Spier Avenue.

**Burglary 2<sup>nd</sup>** CR# 029802 Avalon Drive 11/03-05/10. While the victim was out of town, a relative checked on the house and discovered that the suspect(s) had broken in the rear door and had taken a wallet and a video camera. The wallet and some of its contents were found on the victim's driveway. (See CR # 029787 above.)

In the morning, they discovered that the suspect(s) had entered the unlocked garage and ransacked vehicles.
